Annie Marie Le (July 3, 1985A to September 8, 2009) was a 24-year-old doctorate student at the Yale Medicine School of the Pharmacology Department. She was seen for the last time in a research premise at Campus New Haven on September 8 on September 13, the day she was getting married, she was found dead inside the building. [2] On September 17, the police arrested a suspect, Raymond J. Clark III, a Yale Laboratory Technology that worked in the building. [1] Clark declared herself guilty of murder on March 17, 2011. Disappearance and death On the morning of the September 8, Le left his apartment and took Yale Transit to the Hall Sterling of Medicine on Yale Campus. Around the morning of 10, she walked from Sterling Hall to another campus builder at 10 Amistad Street, where her laboratory research was located. Le had left his bag, cell phone, criterion cards and money in his office at Sterling Hall. She entered the Amistad Street Building soon after 10 o'clock in the morning, as documented in filming of the builder's security cameragers. I was never seen coming out of the prime. In approximately 9th p.m. On the night of September 8, when Le had not yet returned to his house, one of five companions of her house called the police to report her disappearance. [19] On the mat of the disappearance of Le and the discovery of his body, and the sympathy and indignation on the crime all over the world, there was a reaction in some circles to the extensive media coverage , and while most recognized the crime was especially disdainful, some questioned whether the level of interest was guaranteed. Some commentators suggested that the attention given by the media was inappropriately disproportionate to other murder vinitis.
